<p>Bugs Read a non-fiction book about the fascinating world of bugs.</p>	<p>Beasts Read any fiction novel where wild animals are a feature of the narrative.</p>	<p>Book Award Winners Read any fiction novel that has won a major book award. (i.e. Carnegie, Newberry, NZ Post)</p>	<p>Botanical Read a fiction novel set in a garden, forest or jungle.</p>
<p>Bravery Read a fiction or non-fiction biography/ autobiography about an act of heroism.</p>	<p>Bric-a-brac Read a fiction novel that has an unusual item that will feature significantly during the course of the narrative.</p>	<p>Beowulf Read 3 picture books or poetic versions of the classic English poem 'Beowulf'.</p>	<p>Belonging Read a fiction novel about wanting to belong or about trying to fit in.</p>
